



#### 5. Student Support and Progression

5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services

The responsibility for Student Support and Progression has been assigned to Dean Student Support and Progression who is also a member of IQAC. IQAC enhances awareness about student support services available in the college in number of ways.

- Members of the IQAC help in the formation of societies and clubs, which specifically guide the students in various fields and create awareness about student support services. Some of the societies providing student support services are Financial Helpage Society, Fee Concession Committee, Anti-ragging Cell, Grievance Redressal Cell, Anti sexual Harassment Cell, Mentoring and Counselling Cell, Career Advancement Centre, Counselling Cell, Holistic Growth Cell, Career Counselling and Placement Cell etc. Student Council and Discipline Committee play the role of bridge between administration and the students. The office bearers, class representatives and other members help in maintaining discipline, conducting morning assembly, organizing major functions and competitions. IQAC monitors the growth of students as well as the proper functioning of these cells.
- Other student support services available in the college include Canteen and Mess Services, Book Shop and Tuck Shop, Youth Welfare Committee.
- Dean Student Council who is a member of IQAC provides information to the students through announcements in morning assembly regarding various events, extracurricular, co-curricular activities, student support services etc. to the students from time to time.
- IQAC ensures that information to the students regarding details of various courses available and their eligibility conditions, code of conduct, fee structure, details about various societies and clubs, information about faculty, achievements of students and institution, placement of students is provided through annual prospectus.
- Career Counselling Cell and Placement Cell create awareness among students about various available career aspects and placement opportunities in their respective fields.
- Women Empowerment Cell and Gender Sensitization Committee create awareness and motivate students regarding gender equality.
- The institution through student support services provides information regarding various financial benefits available to meritorious, needy, deserving students and to

differently abled students. Information to the students regarding code of conduct, attendance rules, various schemes like earn while you learn is also disseminated through IQAC.

#### 5.2 Efforts made by the institution for tracking the progression

The institution tracks the progression in a number of ways. IQAC ensures the quality in progression of the students. Principal, Members of Local Committee, Nominee local society and Local Committee, Alumni, Media, Experts from academia, Industrialist, Entrepreneurs, Deans, Superintendent, Head Girl are the members of IQAC.

5.4 Details of student support mechanism for coaching for competitive examinations (If any)

Throughout the session coaching for competitive exams, UGC (NET), CA, CPT is given by the institution under Career Advancement Scheme.

• Coaching classes are held for competitive exams such as banking, railway and preliminary exams of IAS/PCS.

- Capsule course of soft skills development such as interview, skills, group discussion are organized to enhance employability and placements in Banks, SSC, Railways, LIC, Civil Services etc.
- Resource persons from outside the college and within the college taught different subjects of competitive exams.
- Requisite study material is provided to students and regular mock tests are conducted by teachers. Once enrolled, students have the facility to revise and give mock tests till they clear any competitive exam.
- The commerce students taking coaching for CA, CS and MBA are given extra time as per their requirement.
- M.Sc. Bioinformatics students are guided for various competitive examinations for Junior Research Fellowships including DBT, ICMR, CSIR, BINC, GATE, ICAR etc. They are also informed about the INSPIRE Fellowship programme for Ph.D. and women scientist programmes offered by the DST.
- Students are also guided for entrance exams for PG courses, M.Phil, Ph.D. in various universities and institutes.
- The students are imparted training through Industrial houses to enhance their employability.
- Visually challenged students are helped in studies and mobility training.

5.6 Details of student counselling and career guidance

The institute provide counselling services to students for academic guidance, career guidance, personal and psycho social development. All the students are divided into small groups – mentoring groups and the students are counselled by their mentors from time to time.

#### a) Academic Counselling

• Academic Counselling is provided to students during admission for choice of subjects and streams according to their interests, aptitudes and IQ. Standardized psychological

questionnaires are used for measurement of intelligence, aptitudes, interests and personality for proper assessment during counselling.

- Specially constituted counselling and admission committee provides counselling to the aspirants in the vocational and skilled areas such as B.Voc. Banking and Financial Services, B.Voc. Web Designing and Multimedia and Community College.
- General guidance regarding the courses and further the scope of subject is discussed by the faculty from time to time.

#### b) Counselling for Career Guidance

- Chandrayaan Vipnet Club of Physics Department organized a guest lecture on the topic 'Indian Space, Nuclear and Defence Programmes: Challenging Career Opportunities for science graduates on 21<sup>st</sup> July, 2018. Dr. Atul Khanna from GNDU Amritsar interacted with students and informed about the various space programmes run and maintained by India. He told that now India has designed its own launch vehicle. The Indian launch vehicle PSLV-C-9 carried 10 rockets of different countries into space. He made students aware of various career opportunities in the field of space, nuclear programmes and defense programmes like ISRO, DRDO and how to prepare for them.
- The Career Counselling Cell organized a student knowledge sharing programme on Soft Skills and GD on 17<sup>th</sup> August, 2018. On this occasion, Prof. Dr. Nidhi Tak from IBS, Gurugram told the students about personality enrichment. She said that attitude, skills and knowledge are the three main aspects of personality. She focussed on communication and interpersonal skills. She also encouraged the students for enhancing team spirit.
- A workshop on Career Counselling was conducted by Mrs. Rajwinder Kaur, Counselor, K.V. School, Jalandhar on 4<sup>th</sup> November, 2018. She emphasized on the significance of choosing the right career, career planning and the role of intelligence and aptitude testing as diagnostic tools.
- The Career Counselling Cell organized a 2-day Education Fair under the able guidance of Prof. Dr. (Mrs.) Ajay Sareen on 20<sup>th</sup> November, 2018. 

The college has fully computerised systems and MIS. Latest softwares have been acquired/developed and adapted for our use. The entire academic and administrative work is regulated through the softwares viz. student data, attendance record, leave records, admission process, examination conduct and results, fee collection, staff profile, salary bills and all other administrative data. Academic activities are managed, regulated and coordinated making extensive use of MIS. Since 2016-17, the institution is doing the admissions and registrations online, the absentees are marked and information computerized is shared with the parents. The library of the college is fully automated. MIS data is regularly updated and made available to all stakeholders. The central management at New Delhi has also been provided access through video conferencing.

# 6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Since the college is affiliated to 5-star State University, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, therefore, development of the curriculum is not finalised at the college level for the regular courses. However, the faculty members of the college have representations on Board of Studies of the University, Faculty of Arts & Social Science, Faculty of Economics & Business, Faculty of Humanities, Faculty of Languages, Faculty of Life Sciences, Faculty of Physical education, Faculty of Sciences, Faculty of Engineering and Technology, where on they make rich contribution for the designing, development and upgradation of the curriculum. The college is also having B-vocational schemes and skill development courses under Community College for which the college designs the syllabi with the association of industry partners and subject experts and same is sent to the University for the approval. The college also analyses the feedback from students and other stakeholders on curriculum and initiates necessary action on the same.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- The college has a system of developing e-modules by the teachers. All teachers are required to develop two e-modules per semester. All such modules are made available to the students of all streams on the web link.
- Innovative teaching tools and methods is the area of our special emphasis. In the faculty meetings, the new techniques useful to the students are deliberated and adopted for the classroom.
- The college is very particular to give added emphasis on knowledge enhancement and sharpening of skills of the students by providing teaching learning inputs using state-of-the-art infrastructure available in the college.
- The college receives and analyses feedback from the students, their parents, industry and the faculty to improve the teaching learning inputs. The same after due deliberations are adopted with every new semester.

- The institution believes that there is an urgent and changing need of new skills and curriculum to make the education employable. For the purpose, the college introduces new courses and upgrades the already running add-on courses as per the needs of the country.
- The teachers are regularly updated regarding the technological advancements in teaching and learning process through the medium of various symposia, conferences, seminars, workshops, faculty development programmes in the college and even outside it, may be at the state, national as well as the international level. The college not only motivates the faculty for such advancements but also provides leave with pay and other financial support.
- The college has devised and adopted new teaching practices related to problem solving and task based learning.
- The students are helped to improve their cognitive thinking, analytical mind and creativity by opening them to the assignment work, participation in seminars and guest lectures as well as research projects.

#### **6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation**

- Semester system has been introduced for all UG & PG courses. Credit Based system has been implemented for community college and B. Vocational courses.
- In every semester, there is a system of monthly tests and full-fledged mid semester examination for all UG and PG classes.
- The evaluation of the answer sheets is discussed with the students and results are analysed at the level of the department as well as at the institution level. The purpose is to make improvements every time with a focus on the betterment of the students.
- The awards are submitted online by the examiners.
- The results are made available online to the students and their parents.
- The college maintains strict vigilance in the internal examinations in order to prevent the occurrence of the unfair means cases.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

• The college firmly believes that R&D is the only answer to upgrade the level of education and sharpening of skills of the students to make them match with the ever changing demands of the society. We believe that not only innovative techniques and continuous efforts are required for this purpose, but also the results can be better achieved through teacher-student partnership in this area.

- The college encourages the teachers and involvement of the students for undertaking research projects, sponsored by UGC/industries or guided by faculty.
- The college provides resource rooms, internet facility, and other administrative assistance for research.
- Open access library, research cabins fully equipped with INFLIBNET are available to the teachers and students alike.
- The teachers are given liberal permission for higher studies like M.Phil., Ph.D. and provide flexi timings for doing course work for Ph.D.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- After every semester, the faculty and staff undergoes the self-appraisal assessment. The feedback is also received from other stakeholders like students, parents and other agencies.
- The reports and feedbacks are analysed at the level of the Principal on the regular basis and improvements are made in the administrative and teaching work in the college on the basis of such assessments.

• The college organises orientation programmes for new recruits in teaching and non-teaching after they are selected in a professional and a transparent manner.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff Recruitment

- The vacant posts of regular and contractual faculty are advertised and filled by DAVCMC, New Delhi, the governing body of the college.
- The ad-hoc faculty is recruited at the college level. For subjects in which the number of applicants is quite large (exceeding 100) like of Commerce and Computer Science, the candidates are short listed on the basis of written test. The short listed candidates are interviewed by a panel of interviewers comprising Chairman LC, the College Principal, other members of LC representatives, Dean Academics and HOD as subject expert.
- The selection is made on merit basis.
- The college retains the teachers who have served the institution earlier and proved their excellence while in service.
- Vacant non-teaching and supporting staff positions are filled at the college level. All the four Superintendents viz. Office Supdt., Supdt. Gen. Supdt. Accounts, Hostel Supdt. constitute the panel of selection committee with Principal in the chair.

#### 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

- The college has MoUs with various industries for providing academic inputs and collaborations in training and appointment of the students.
- As per the MoUs, regular meetings are held, industrial visits are arranged and internship programmes are made where necessary.
- The linkage with the industry is also made use of for improvement of the curriculum and teaching methodologies.
- Extension lectures by the experts and workshops for the staff and students sharpen the professional skills which in turn facilitate attractive employments.
