
RESULT OF ANALYSIS OF ALUMNAE QUESTIONNAIRE

(Session 2017-18)

It is an active and impressive body with graduation and post graduationregistering both as life members and annual members. Till date, 95 alumnae have registered as life members of the Association. The Association not only promotes and inspires a sense of belongingness among the old students for its Alma Mater but also collect Alumnae's suggestions and observations in the form of feedback for the development of the Institution.


With an objective to make an assessment of the institution with a view to make overall assessment regarding academic, infrastructure, placements, work culture, structural capability and the general environment of the college, which has already excelled in the northern region, alumnae questionnaires (Annexure) were prepared and got filled from 799 alumnae of the session 2017-18. An analysis is presented hereunder:

CURRENT STATUS




63.07% of alumnae have joined higher education and a satisfactory number i.e. 31.64% have professionally settled. It is a satisfying achievement of the college.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE




Over one-third alumnae i.e. 34.29% have expressed that admission procedure of the college is very good, 33.41% grade it is as good and the remaining 28.77% declared it as an excellent one. As such, 94.48% alumnae are of the view that there is hardly any scope for further imporvement in the admission procedure of the college.

FEE STRUCTURE




On the point of fee structure, as many as 73.59% of alumnae rate it as excellent, very good or good, thereby a vast majority feels satisfy with the fee structure of the college.

CAMPUS ENVIRONMENT




Regarding environment of the campus, the information from alumnae reveals 39.3% declaring it as excellent and 56.07% grading it as very good or good. Therefore, 98.37% alumnae are more than satisfied with the campus environment.

FACULTY




Faculty is the backbone of any institution. 70.71% alumnae submitted the response that the faculty of the college is excellent or very good while 20.78% of our alumnae claim that it is good. Thus, almost the entire alumnae (i.e. 96.37%) are satisfied with the faculty.

QUALITY OF SUPPORT MATERIAL IN TEACHING AND LEARNING





ENCOURAGEMENT OF EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES





INFRASTRUCTURE AND LAB FACILITIES





LIBRARY FACILITIES





CANTEEN FACILITIES





HOSTEL FACILITIES





CAREER COUNSELLING





PLACEMENT INITIATIVES





REDRESSAL OF GRIEVIANCE





<u>ALUMNI ASSOCIATION – NETWORK OF OLD FRIENDS</u>





OVERALL RATING OF THE COLLEGE




37.67% of our alumnae rated the college as excellent, 35.54% rated it as very good and 20.03% rated it as good. Thus 96.99% of our alumnae are satisfied with the overall performance of the college.

IMPROVEMENT IN TEACHING-LEARNING PROCESS




The data analysis shows that 54.19% of respondents did not find any scope for improvement in the teaching/learning process of the college where as 45.81% have indicated that there is scope for improvement (13.39% believe that more emphasis should be given on research strategies and practical knowledge, 4.51% emphasised on tests, assignments and seminars, 6% feel that there should be more interaction between students and teachers and teaching methodologies should be improved, 3.87% finds a need to provide more placements and industrial visits, smart classes, and e-learning resources, 0.25% laid stress on career counselling and 9.13% believe that more free lectures and notes should be given and fee structure should be improved).

CONTRIBUTION FOR THE BETTERMENT OF THE INSTITTUTE



Contribution of the alumnae to the institution is not only an asset but it also speaks aloud of the satisfactory growth and development of the college. Liberally coming forward for their contribution, 15.14% alumnae offered free teaching services, and job or awareness programmes, 34.54% promised financial help to the needy students, 31.16% responded that they would motivate good students to join this institution, 6.25% readily agreed to be a part of the college by getting involved as a member giving regular suggestions. 3.25% expressed their willingness to help the college in improving the rules and regulations for maintaining discipline. The remaining 41.05% alumnae did not find any scope for further improvement in the college.

OVERALL IMPROVEMENT IN COLLEGE ENVIRONMENT



The data reveals that 72.08% of our alumnae claim that there is no need of improvement in the overall environment of the college where as remaining 27.92% have indicated that there is a scope for improvement in different areas like more emphasis on placements, sports and hobby classes, online facility for fee submission and dues clearance, friendly behaviour and liberty, improvement in infrastructure and more student participation and practical work.
